

Heatherwick's Little Island in the Hudson

THE BUILDING OF

Heatherwick Studio's new park at 55 Hudson Greenway on the Hudson River, just off the shoreline in New York's Chelsea neighbourhood, is now underway, after some wrangling in the courts over its suitability. Little Island is both park and performance space, and the design

comprises 132 planters made up of mushroomshaped concrete columns that rise above the water. The 2.4-acre green space will include 100 different species of indigenous trees and plants that are suited to the harsh New York climate. It is due to open in 2021.

£1M TO REJUVENATE HIGHDOWN

A £1M PROJECT is

underway at Highdown Gardens in Worthing to protect the fragile plant collection and enhance the visitor experience. The improvements are being funded by the National Lottery's Heritage Lottery Fund (HLF) and will include new greenhouses to help propagate and preserve the Gardens' rare plants, as well as a new visitors' centre. Highdown, which



is currently closed but will reopen later this summer, is internationally important because of its unique chalk soil conditions, which support hundreds of rare plants and trees. highdowngardens.co.uk

GARDEN MASTERCLASSES LAUNCHES NEW COURSES


THE CURATORS OF the

WINNERS OF THE LI AWARDS 2019 LEAD THE WAY

THE JUDGES OF the 2019 Landscape Institute (LI) Awards have put the climate and biodiversity emergency at the top of the agenda this year, bestowing Sir David Attenborough with a Lifetime Achievement Award and an Honourary Fellowship of the LI, and giving other prizes to schemes that address the crisis. Europe's largest living wall finished

A £1.5 MILLION living wall measuring 25,000 square feet and featuring 120,000 plants has been installed at the McArthurGlen Designer Outlet in Ashford, Kent, Setting the record as the largest living wall in Europe, it has been designed by green infrastructure company, Biotecture, to reduce air pollution, increase biodiversity and lift the mood of visitors. It spans the walls of the new entrance promenade, walkways and many of the 50 new stores, and the planting includes Euonymus fortunei, Lonicera nitida, ivy and heucheras to provide year-round coverage and texture. biotecture.uk.com; mcarthurglen.com
