With these many opportunities comes a growing need for professionals who have sympathy for country houses. Based in west London, the boutique studio takes on landscape and planting design, project administration and garden styling across the UK and internationally, with equal numbers of town and country gardens. The studio is also known for its garden lighting design. ## Marian Boswall Landscape Architects

Leading landscape architect and plantswoman Marian Boswall is a fellow of the Landscape Institute and heads a small team of horticultural specialists and designers working across the UK and internationally from a studio in Kent. The practice offers a complete landscape-design service, from conception through planning and tender to



the supervision of landscape construction and planting. Current projects include the restoration of the Philip Sassoon garden for the new Giraffe Hall hotel at Port Lympne in Kent, a contemporary landscape around the walled garden of 19th-century socialite and plantswoman Lady Dorothy Nevill, and a private sculpture garden and meditation retreat for a 20th-century art dealer.

Known for a strong understanding of how a garden relates to both the house and the land beyond and for planting that feels natural to the site, Mrs Boswall favours timeless and sustainable design, combined with a deep understanding of the natural world. She is a fervent believer in the healing power of plants and sits on the board of the Blackthorn Trust healing garden in Kent.
